His own history with dyslexia and ADHD drives him to give back to those in similar situations, and he has demonstrated a lifelong passion for helping others conquer their personal challenges.

In 2012, Mandarino received a Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medal to commemorate his contributions. His philanthropic work has also been acknowledged by a number of national media outlets and letters of appreciation from community leaders.
